



#### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF VALLIAMMAI ENGINEERING COLLEGE

#### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

- Students should wear and display ID cards while in the campus.
- Cell phone should not be used in the campus.
- Students should be regular in attending classes in time.
- Students should actively involve in curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities.
- Leave letters should be submitted in advance.
- Students should not involve in malpractice during examinations.

#### Attendance

Leave letters should be signed/counter signed by parents/guardians. Medical leave letters should be accompanied by medical certificate and to be produced in time. Prior permission must be obtained to avail of leave, failing which the leave letters should be submitted on the day of reporting back to the college or within two days from the commencement of leave, whichever is earlier.

#### **Dress code**

Male students are to wear clean decent formal pants and shirts neatly tucked-in. Female students are expected to be dressed in sarees or salwar kameez with pinned up dupatta. Any other kind of dress is totally restricted. All the students are expected to wear proper, formal shoes only. Chappals / sandals are not allowed.

#### **Dress Code for Laboratories**

The uniform for laboratories of I,II,III and IV year students will be prescribed by their respective Heads of Departments.

#### **CAMPUS FACILITIES**

#### **Physical Education**

The Physical Education Department was incepted in the year 1999. Our boys and girls actively participate in all major tournaments including Cricket, Football, Basket ball and Volley ball. The tournaments are being conducted by Chengalpet division of Anna University. All sports amenities are provided to our students. The College has a very good Basket ball court and a Tennis court. #### Library Facilities

The spacious library is with a collection of about 40,211 books, 226 National & International Journals and 9,160 e-journals. There are technical, general and reference books to cater to the needs of the various branches of study. There are about 2,558 CDs in the library which can be used in the library itself.

The Central Library consists of Reference Section, Journal Section, Digital Library, Reading Hall, Stack-Room and Binding Section. The library has unique collection of Encyclopedia, Handbooks, Textbooks, Journals, Video Cassettes and CD's, etc. to cater to the needs of various branches of study.

The Library is fully automated. It consists of modules of Acquisitions, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serial Control, Article Indexing & OPAC. Circulation system of books is based on Bar-Code. OPAC provide facilities to Staff & Students to access the Books and other Reading materials available in the library.

Reprography facility is available in the library to help the users take photocopy of the required library materials. There is a digital library with the student Project Reports and other College Publications. There is a library committee represented by the various departments to advise the librarian related to the requirement of books and journals.

The rules and regulations to be adhered in the library are given below. They are intended to regulate the use of library resources and will be reviewed periodically to meet the changing needs.

#### Membership

Membership is open to all the staff and students of the college.

#### Conditions of Loan

- 1. The books must be returned on or before the due date.
- 2. Book will be renewed only if there are no reservations.
- 3. Books have to be physically presented at the Circulation Desk for renewal.
- 4. For late return of books overdue charges will be levied as noted below.

After 2 days and upto 30 days	Rs.1.00/Day/book
After 30 days and upto 90 days	Rs.2.00/Day/book
After 90 days	Rs.5.00/Day/book

- 5. After Issue or Return of documents, the members are requested to check the Status of their membership account for correct transactions.
- 6. Student members should produce their identity cards along with library cards at the time of borrowing books.
- 7. Members are requested to check the condition of the book before issue. Any damage should be immediately reported to the librarian failingwhich the member to whom the book is issued will be held responsible.
- 8. Reference books are not for issue.
- 9. Books that are in special demand may be lent out for a shorter period as may be necessary and books lent out may be recalled at any time, if required.

#### Loss of Books

- 1. Loss of any book borrowed must be reported immediately to the Library in the prescribed form available at the Circulation Desk.
- 2. Lost books must be replaced by the user with the latest edition with over due charges if any.

### Loss of Library Cards

- 1. Loss of Library Cards should be reported at the library immediately.
- 2. Duplicate Library cards will be issued on penalty payment of Rs. 100/for staff with an undertaking that they will continue to be held responsible for any loss occurring from inadvertent use or misuse of the cards lost.

#### **Reservation of Books**

Members can reserve the books, which are already issued. The reserved books, after their return, will be kept at the counter for two days for issue to those who have reserved. If they fail to collect the books within two days, the books will be allotted to the members in the waiting list.

#### Access to E Resources

The Library provides facilities to access IEEE, ASME, ASCE, Elsevier Science Directory, Springer, McGraw-Hill, ASTM Digital Library, EBSCO (Management and Social Science), JGATE (Science & Technology) and JGATE (Management) Periodicals. Members are permitted to use this facility after entering the register maintained in the Digital Library.

#### No Dues Certificate

All student members should return their library cards at the end of their final year and obtain "No Dues Certificate" from the library. Similarly, the staff members who intend to leave the College should submit all the library cards and obtain "No Dues Certificate" from the library.

#### **General Rules**

- 1. All the student members should wear/ produce their identity cards inside the library.
- 2. All members shall sign in the gate register at the entrance as a token of their acceptance to adhere to the rules of library.
- 3. Personal books, files and other articles (except loose sheets of papers) are not allowed inside the library.
- 4. Strict silence shall be observed inside the library.
- 5. Any marking or writing inside the books by the members is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Using mobile phone inside the library is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Misbehaviour in the library will lead to cancellation of membership and would also lead to serious disciplinary action.
- 8. Not withstanding anything stated in these rules, the decision of the authorities of this institution shall be final and binding on all matters.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE RAGGING : AN OFFENCE

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a Cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the College / Institution/University.

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazatte Extra ordinary dt. 29.1.97 (Bill No. 8 of 1997 Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act)

- 1. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, 'Ragging' means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes
  - (a) Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student or
  - (b) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.
- 2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
- 3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in abets or propagates "Ragging" within or outside educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-.
- 4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in other educational institutions.
- 5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

1. Title of the practice	Value-added programs for betterment of skill upgradation
2. The context that required the initiation of the practice	There are two types of learners: (i) Advanced Learners and (ii) Slow learners. The slow learners are provided with some opportunities to improve their academic performance, whereas the advanced learners should be provided with opportunities to improve their skill set. One such a way to do the same it to offer Value-Added Courses (VAC). The courses will enable the students to learn beyond the syllabus content, to acquire additional technological or technical skills in the domain of their choice, thereby providing more opportunistic in getting campus placements.
3. Objectives of the practice	<ul> <li>To provide opportunity for the fast learners to acquire additional skill set</li> <li>To offer variety of courses to the students</li> <li>To obtain certification in the domain of interest of the students</li> <li>To teach the content beyond the syllabus</li> <li>To conduct "hands-on" for better understanding of the content</li> </ul>

1. Title of the practice	Bio-Metric attendance for employees	
2. The context that required the initiation of the practice	Attendance recording and monitoring is a vital process in a working environment. The manual attendance registration (signature) is sometimes spurious. Hence, the alternate registration process is required for further monitoring.	
3. Objectives of the practice	<ul> <li>To know the status of attendance of the employees</li> <li>To monitor the attendance percentage of employees</li> <li>To find remedy for problems, if any</li> <li>To facilitate the status report on daily-basis through the device</li> </ul>	
4. The Practice	The bio-metric attendance registration process was initiated through bio-metric device. This accepts the fingerprint impression of the employees. During the installation process, all the employees need to register their fingerprints in the device. On every day, as the employee reported for the duties, he/she should record the attendance by punching the finger impression in the device, which recognizes the same with the earlier registration process. This has to be done in both the forenoon session and afternoon session. The employee should also register the fingerprint impression as he/she report and leave on permission also, as the case may be.	
5. Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them	<ul> <li>Obstacle: As the number of employees is in hundreds in the institution, a single device cannot accommodate the entries. In some point of time, the employees may come as crowd and over this situation, they may not be able to record their presence.</li> <li>Strategy adopted: So as to provide the flexibility to register the attendance of the employees, the biometric devices are situated at multiple locations, namely admin block, first year block and new building. This eases the crowd of employees to scatter into any one of the three devices wherein he/she can punch the attendance. This eases the disbursement of crowd from a single point to multiple points.</li> </ul>	



6. Impact of the practice	The employees are trained to use the device in a short span of time. The higher authorities in the institution are able to find the attendance report of employees, instantly.	
7. Resources required:	Bio-metric devices, adopters and locations are the essential resources for this initiative.
