

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF VALLIAMMAI ENGINEERING COLLEGE

GENERALINSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

- Students should wear and display ID cards while in the campus.
- Cell phone should not be used in the campus.
- Students should be regular in attending classes in time.
- Students should actively involve in curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities.
- Leave letters should be submitted in advance.
- Students should not involve in malpractice during examinations.

Attendance

Leave letters should be signed/counter signed by parents/guardians. Medical leave letters should be accompanied by medical certificate and to be produced in time. Prior permission must be obtained to avail of leave, failing which the leave letters should be submitted on the day of reporting back to the college or within two days from the commencement of leave, whichever is earlier.

Dress code

Male students are to wear clean decent formal pants and shirts neatly tucked-in. Female students are expected to be dressed in sarees or salwar kameez with pinned up dupatta. Any other kind of dress is totally restricted. All the students are expected to wear proper, formal shoes only. **Chappals/sandals are not allowed**.

Dress Code for Laboratories

The uniform for laboratories of I,II,III and IV year students will be prescribed by their respective Heads of Departments.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

Physical Education

Library Facilities

The spacious library is with a collection of about 41,307 books, 226 National & International Journals, 12,236 e-journals and 333 e-books. There are technical, general and reference books to cater to the needs of the various branches of study. There are about 1,759 CDs in the library which can be used in the library itself.

The Central Library consists of Reference Section, Journal Section, Digital Library, Reading Hall, Stack-Room and Binding Section. The library has unique collection of Encyclopedia, Handbooks, Textbooks, Journals, Video Cassettes and CD's, etc. to cater to the needs of various branches of study.

The Library is fully automated. It consists of modules of Acquisitions, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serial Control, Article Indexing & OPAC. Circulation system of books is based on Bar-Code. OPAC provide facilities to Staff & Students to access the Books and other Reading materials available in the library.

Reprography facility is available in the library to help the users take photocopy of the required library materials. There is a digital library with the student Project Reports and other College Publications. There is a library committee represented by the various departments to advise the librarian related to the requirement of books and journals.

The rules and regulations to be adhered in the library are given below. They are intended to regulate the use of library resources and will be reviewed periodically to meet the changing needs.

Membership

Membership is open to all the staff and students of the college.

- 5. After Issue or Return of documents, the members are requested to check the Status of their membership account for correct transactions.
- 6. Student members should produce their identity cards along with library cards at the time of borrowing books.
- 7. Members are requested to check the condition of the book before issue. Any damage should be immediately reported to the librarian failingwhich the member to whom the book is issued will be held responsible.
- 8. Reference books are not for issue.
- Books that are in special demand may be lent out for a shorter period as may be necessary and books lent out may be recalled at any time, if required.

Loss of Books

- 1. Loss of any book borrowed must be reported immediately to the Library in the prescribed form available at the Circulation Desk.
- 2. Lost books must be replaced by the user with the latest edition with over due charges if any.

Loss of Library Cards

- 1. Loss of Library Cards should be reported at the library immediately.
- Duplicate Library cards will be issued on penalty payment of Rs. 100/for staff with an undertaking that they will continue to be held
 responsible for any loss occurring from inadvertent use or misuse of the
 cards lost.

Reservation of Books

Members can reserve the books, which are already issued. The reserved books, after their return, will be kept at the counter for two days for issue to those who have reserved. If they fail to collect the books within two days, the books will be allotted to the members in the waiting list.

Access to e-Resources

The Library provides facilities to access IEEE, ASME, ASCE, Elsevier Science Directory, Springer, McGraw-Hill, ASTM Digital Library, EBSCO (Management and Social Science), JGATE (Science & Technology) and JGATE (Management) Periodicals. Members are permitted to use this facility after entering the register maintained in the Digital Library.

No Dues Certificate

All student members should return their library cards at the end of their final year and obtain "No Dues Certificate" from the library. Similarly, the staff members who intend to leave the College should submit all the library cards and obtain "No Dues Certificate" from the library.

General Rules

- 1. All the student members should wear/ produce their identity cards inside the library.
- 2. All members shall sign in the gate register at the entrance as a token of their acceptance to adhere to the rules of library.
- 3. Personal books, files and other articles (except loose sheets of papers) are not allowed inside the library.
- 4. Strict silence shall be observed inside the library.
- 5. Any marking or writing inside the books by the members is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Using mobile phone inside the library is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Misbehaviour in the library will lead to cancellation of membership and would also lead to serious disciplinary action.
- 8. Not withstanding anything stated in these rules, the decision of the authorities of this institution shall be final and binding on all matters.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

RAGGING: AN OFFENCE

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a Cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the College / Institution/University.

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazatte Extra ordinary dt. 29.1.97 (Bill No. 8 of 1997 Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act)

- In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, 'Ragging' means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes
 - (a) Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student or
 - (b) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.
- 2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
- 3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in abets or propagates "Ragging" within or outside educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs. 10, 000/-.
- 4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in other educational institutions.
- 5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

RULES & REGULATIONS FOR VEC STUDENTS

- To enforce discipline among students, dress code of the college is strictly adhered to. They should attend the college in formal dress. The boys are not supposed to wear jeans and T-shirts when they attend college and girls should wear churidars with pinned dupattas.
- 2. Students should wear black or brown shoes only.
- Students should wear valid college ID cards with tags and it should not be kept in the pockets/bags. Otherwise, they will not be permitted to enter the campus and attend the classes.
- 4. All undergraduate (UG) students should wear laboratory coats whenever they attend laboratory classes.
- 5. Students should not bring mobile phones to college. For emergency, a common phone facility is available on payment basis. However, if a student is found using mobile phone, he/she will be suspended for 10 working days. In the beginning of every semester, every student on roll should register for that semester as per Registration Form with an Undertaking, failing which the student will not be permitted to attend classes.
- Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes and all activities connected to the college. Late comers will not be allowed to attend classes under any circumstances.
- 7. If a student does not attend college without prior permission for more than three days consecutively, it will be intimated to the parents. Parents should meet the HOD concerned along with the student and should give a written undertaking, as per Format A, confirming regular attendance thereof, and then only the student will be permitted to attend further classes.
- 8. Periodical Tests will be conducted for all the departments on common dates as per the schedule, communicated in the beginning of every semester.
- 9. If a student fails to attend Periodical Tests the student will be awarded zero mark. Retest will be conducted only for the student with genuine reason.
- 10. Procedures for awarding marks for internal assessment(IA): The maximum marks assigned to different courses shall be as given below: Each of the theory and practical courses (including project work) shall carry a maximum of 100 marks of which 20 marks will be through internal assessment and the End Semester Examination (ESE) will carry 80 marks. The marks for the continuous assessment shall be awarded as per the procedure given below:

Theory Courses: Three tests each carrying 100 marks shall be conducted during the semester by the Department / College concerned. The total marks obtained in all tests put together out of 300, shall be proportionately reduced for 20 marks and rounded to the nearest integer (This also implies equal weightage to all the three tests).

Practical Courses: The maximum marks for Internal Assessment shall be 20 in case of practical courses. Every practical exercise / experiment shall be evaluated based on conduct of experiment / exercise and records maintained. There shall be at least one test. The criteria for arriving at the Internal Assessment marks of 20 is as follows: 75 marks shall be awarded for successful completion of all the prescribed experiments done in the Laboratory and 25 marks for the test. The total mark shall be reduced to 20 and rounded to the

nearest integer. For further details, please refer Regulations 2013. However, at the end of every Periodical Test, the progress report as per Format B, will be sent by post / handed over to students for getting the signature of their parents and the same should be returned to the coordinator within a week.

- 11. During the working hours, students should be in their respective classrooms / laboratories or library. They should not loiter or gather in common places like portico, pathways and canteen.
- 12. Attendance percentage is calculated as follows

% Attendance = Total number of periods attended

Total number of periods conducted x 100

Students having less than 75% of attendance will be counselled by the Class Co-ordinator every fortnight. In turn, the student should submit an undertaking to the Co-ordinator as per Format C, confirming regular attendance, thereof.

- 13. Indiscipline of students, in any form, will be viewed very seriously and such students will be issued TC, irrespective of their academic performance.
- 14. As per the rules of the Anna University, a student who fails to maintain a minimum of 75% of attendance, in a particular semester, will be detained. Such student is not eligible to appear for the University examinations in that semester and he/she cannot continue his/her studies in the subsequent semester. He has to redo the courses of that semester along with his juniors in the subsequent academic year. However, he/she will be permitted to appear for arrear examinations.
- 15. Students, who have three or more arrears, will be considered as poor performers and special classes will be conducted for such students from 4.15pm to 5.15 pm on all working days. All the poor performers should attend such special classes without fail. Such of those poor performers, who secure more than 75% of marks in all the subjects in the Periodical Tests conducted subsequently, will be exempted from attending special classes. However, if such students do not perform well in the next Periodical Tests, they have to continue attending special classes. All the poor performers should abide by this rule of VEC and TC will be issued to the defaulters.
- 16. In practical classes, students should complete all previous record work in all aspects. In the absence of that, they will not be permitted to do the next experiment.
- 17. Students are strictly instructed not to attend any works such as NSS, Sports, Placement, Conference and Seminar without prior approval from the HOD concerned and Principal.




