Through Curriculum Enrichment Committee, we discuss with Internal and external experts from academia and experts from Industry and Alumni for Enriching the Curriculum. By involving the stakeholders in the curriculum design, the college ensures that the curriculum developed encompasses components for employability, research, topics in emerging trends, social relevance and social needs.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Outcome based education method has been followed and developed.
- Creation of learning environment in classes which includes critical thinking, case analysis and innovative method.
- For all programmes practical orientation is insisted in the form of projects, Mini projects, industrial visit, guest lectures, workshops, seminars and symposium.
- Teaching and Learning process is strengthened with the help of e-learning Resources NPTEL) and On-line Learning (Model) software.
- Faculty development programmes and in-service oriented trainings are conducted every semester to enrich their teaching-learning methods.
- Remedial classes are given to slow learners. Mock interviews and group discussion are a part of simulation exercises helping them in placements.
- Mentoring and counselling of slow learners are part of teaching and learning process.



#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Three Internal Assessment Test are conducted and are being evaluated within 3 days after completion the exams.
- Internal marks are allotted based on the assessment test marks and the student's attendance Percentage.
- Theory and practical examinations consists of two components Namely,
   External evaluation for 80% marks and internal evaluation for 20% marks.
   Every day Slip test are conducted for all the subjects.
- The attendance as well as the assessment marks is communicated to the parents through mobile, e-mails, letters and parent teachers meeting conducted every semester to review the performance of the students.
- Counselling of students every month to find out the academic progress and guide them towards improvement based on remedial classes.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- The Research and Development Cell is established with an objective of promoting research by students and the faculty members in newly emerging and challenging areas of Engineering, Technology, Science and Humanities. R&D Cell encourages the faculty members and students for sending research proposals and receiving funds from various research bodies.
- Faculty provided with On Duty, Registration fee refunds for participating in conference, FDP, Seminars etc.
- Encouraging faculty to organize, attend and present papers at state/national/international conferences and seminars.
- Faculty members and students are motivated to publish their research papers in reputed national and international journals / conferences. Faculty members are guiding the students to do grant-in aid research under student project scheme. Experts from reputed institutions are invited for R & D related interactions. The project proposals are usually examined and evaluated by the Project scrutinizing committee before they get sent to the funding agency.

- **Library** has sufficient e-journals which include Science direct, Springer & IEEE etc. and sufficient back volumes for all the departments. Digital library facilities with National and International online journals are also provided. Library administrations like issue / return of books are maintained through commercial library software. The library building is enabled with Wi-fi facility. Every year, additional volumes of books are added based on the requirements from all the departments.
- ICT: All class rooms, tutorials rooms, seminar halls, laboratories pertaining each
  department is enabled with ICT tools. For every subject, power point presentation and
  animated videos are being prepared by the faculty members and it is used for taking
  classes in an interactive way.

  to Recruitment committee consisting of Principal, Dean Academics, HOD, senior
  faculty and External subject expertise for further action.

- Faculties are supported financially to attend Conference / Workshop & FDP's conducted outside the Institution.

Reprography facility is available in the library to help the users take photocopy of the required library materials. There is a digital library with the student Project Reports and other College Publications. There is a library committee represented by the various departments to advise the librarian related to the requirement of books and journals.

#### Reservation of Books

Members can reserve the books, which are already issued. The reserved books, after their return, will be kept at the counter for two days for issue to those who have reserved. If they fail to collect the books within two days, the books will be allotted to the members in the waiting list.

#### Access to e-Resources

The Library provides facilities to access IEEE, ASME, ASCE, Elsevier Science Directory, Springer, McGraw-Hill, ASTM Digital Library, EBSCO (Management and Social Science), JGATE (Science & Technology) and JGATE (Management) Periodicals. Members are permitted to use this facility after entering the register maintained in the Digital Library.

#### No Dues Certificate

All student members should obtain 'No Dues Certificate' from the library at the end of every semester before getting the Hall Ticket.

- 8. Not withstanding anything stated in these rules, the decision of the authorities of this institution shall be final and binding on all matters.

### IMPORTANT NOTICE

**RAGGING: AN OFFENCE** 

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a Cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the College / Institution/University.

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazatte Extra ordinary dt. 29.1.97 (Bill No. 8 of 1997 Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act)

- In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, 'Ragging' means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes
  - (a) Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student or
  - (b) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.
- 2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
- 3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in abets or propagates "Ragging" within or outside educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs. 10, 000/-.
- 4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in other educational institutions.
- 5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

### **RULES & REGULATIONS FOR VEC STUDENTS**

- To enforce discipline among students, dress code of the college is strictly adhered to. They should attend the college in formal dress. The boys are not supposed to wear jeans and T-shirts when they attend college and girls should wear churidars with pinned dupattas.
- 2. Students should wear black or brown shoes only.
- Students should wear valid college ID cards with tags and it should not be kept in the pockets/bags. Otherwise, they will not be permitted to enter the campus and attend the classes.
- All undergraduate (UG) students should wear laboratory coats whenever they attend laboratory classes.
- 5. Students should not bring mobile phones to college. For emergency, a common phone facility is available on payment basis. However, if a student is found using mobile phone, he/she will be suspended for 10 working days. In the beginning of every semester, every student on roll should register for that semester as per Registration Form with an Undertaking, failing which the student will not be permitted to attend classes.
- Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes and all activities connected to the college. Late comers will not be allowed to attend classes under any circumstances.
- 7. If a student does not attend college without prior permission for more than three days consecutively, it will be intimated to the parents. Parents should meet the HOD concerned along with the student and should give a written undertaking, as per Format A, confirming regular attendance thereof, and then only the student will be permitted to attend further classes.
- 8. Periodical Tests will be conducted for all the departments on common dates as per the schedule, communicated in the beginning of every semester.
- 9. If a student fails to attend Periodical Tests the student will be awarded zero mark. Retest will be conducted only for the student with genuine reason.
- 10. Procedures for awarding marks for internal assessment(IA): The maximum marks assigned to different courses shall be as given below: Each of the theory and practical courses (including project work) shall carry a maximum of 100 marks of which 20 marks will be through internal assessment and the End Semester Examination (ESE) will carry 80 marks. The marks for the continuous assessment shall be awarded as per the procedure given below:

Theory Courses: Three tests each carrying 100 marks shall be conducted during the semester by the Department / College concerned. The total marks obtained in all tests put together out of 300, shall be proportionately reduced for 20 marks and rounded to the nearest integer (This also implies equal weightage to all the three tests).

Practical Courses: The maximum marks for Internal Assessment shall be 20 in case of practical courses. Every practical exercise / experiment shall be evaluated based on conduct of experiment / exercise and records maintained. There shall be at least one test. The criteria for arriving at the Internal Assessment marks of 20 is as follows: 75 marks shall be awarded for successful completion of all the prescribed experiments done in the Laboratory and 25 marks for the test. The total mark shall be reduced to 20 and rounded to the

- nearest integer. For further details, please refer Regulations 2013/2017 as the case may be. However, at the end of every Periodical Test, the progress report as per Format B, will be sent by post / handed over to students for getting the signature of their parents and the same should be returned to the coordinator within a week
- 11. During the working hours, students should be in their respective classrooms / laboratories or library. They should not loiter or gather in common places like portico, pathways and canteen.
- 12. Attendance percentage is calculated as follows

% Attendance = Total number of periods attended

Total number of periods conducted x 100

Students having less than 75% of attendance will be counselled by the Class Co-ordinator every fortnight. In turn, the student should submit an undertaking to the Co-ordinator as per Format C, confirming regular attendance, thereof.

- 13. Indiscipline of students, in any form, will be viewed very seriously and such students will be issued TC, irrespective of their academic performance.
- 14. As per the rules of the Anna University, a student who fails to maintain a minimum of 75% of attendance, in a particular semester, will be detained. Such student is not eligible to appear for the University examinations in that semester and he/she cannot continue his/her studies in the subsequent semester. He has to redo the courses of that semester along with his juniors in the subsequent academic year. However, he/she will be permitted to appear for arrear examinations.
- 15. Students, who have three or more arrears, will be considered as poor performers and special classes will be conducted for such students from 4.00 pm to 5.00 pm on all working days. All the poor performers should attend such special classes without fail. Such of those poor performers, who secure more than 75% of marks in all the subjects in the Periodical Tests conducted subsequently, will be exempted from attending special classes. However, if such students do not perform well in the next Periodical Tests, they have to continue attending special classes. All the poor performers should abide by this rule of VEC and TC will be issued to the defaulters.
- 16. In practical classes, students should complete all previous record work in all aspects. In the absence of that, they will not be permitted to do the next experiment.
- Students are strictly instructed not to attend any works such as NSS, Sports, Placement, Conference and Seminar without prior approval from the HOD concerned and Principal.
